CONDITIONS FOR ENTERING THE COMPANION DOG SHOW

Challenge Certificate (or any award that counts towards the title of champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club), Reserve Challenge Certificate or Junior Warrant winners are not eligible for entry in pedigree classes at Companion Dog Shows.

Jack Russell Terriers are not eligible for pedigree classes (except for Parson Russell Terriers).

Puppies under 6 months old are not eligible for exhibition at this show.

Please do not bring bitches in season to this show.

Dogs must be kept on leads at all times unless otherwise instructed.

Children must be controlled and supervised by an adult at all times, the adult being responsible for the child's actions.

Please make sure that no dog is brought to the show which has contracted or has been knowingly exposed to any infectious or contagious disease during the 21 days prior to the show, or is suffering from a condition which adversely affects its health or welfare.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS:

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offer the following guidance to help guide you through the dos and don'ts of travelling to, and whilst at, Kennel Club licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned, seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep your dog in the shade - take your own shade, for example a large umbrella.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember - if you feel hot, your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare at all times.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.
